INFO DESK



If you have any questions or concerns feel free to turn to the Info Desk located at the main entrance of the Forum building. There will be a **Lost and Found** box at the Info Desk. You will also find a **bulletin board with the latest announcements** next to the Info Desk. If any changes are made in the programme, or in parking hours, you will find them here.

Opening Hours: 08:00-09:30 / 11:00-20:30 / 22:00-23:30 (changes will be announced on the bulletin board.)

CONGRESS STAFF

A **black** congress badge and wristband identifies all the staff members. Volunteers wear a yellow badge and wristband, and a **yellow** visibility vest. MEDICAL STAFF wear a **red** visibility vest and SAFETY STAFF wear a **green** visibility vest.

They are ready to help and assist you. Please respect and follow their instructions.

CONGRESS BADGE AND WRISTBAND

You should **wear the AYC2017 badge and wristband visibly at all times.** They are also needed to identify you as a congress member for meal times. SAFETY STAFF will request you to show your congress badge and wristband at the security points.

Some participants have a **"no photograph" icon** on their badge. **Do not take pictures of them** as they may face persecution in their countries for attending a Christian conference.



INTERNET AND CHARGING STATIONS

Access to the internet is available in the Internet Café. You will also be able to charge your mobile phones there. Places are limited. (see page 48).

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

You should keep your valuables with you at all times. You are responsible for your personal belongings.

MAIN ENTRANCE

The main entrance is locked during the night between 01:00h and 07:00h. Medical and safety and security teams will always be on-site in case of emergencies.

PARKING

You may park your car in Feria's parking free of charge. You must get a congress badge for your car at reception and leave it visible at all times.

Parking opening hours are:

Tuesday 1st August: 08:00 to 01:00

Wednesday 2nd August to Saturday 5th August: 07:00 to 01:00

Sunday 6th August: 08:00 to 14:00 (any changes will be announced on the Info Desk Bulletin Board)

CATERING

In order to get your meals, you must show your AYC 2017 badge and wristband (red, orange, black or yellow). Meals will be served in the Catering Hall, in the Forum Building, Level 3, next to the pavilion where we will have the general sessions. Volunteers will guide you to your corresponding meal line. See the congress schedule for meal hours (p. 36-37).





AYC 2017 CONGRESS STORE

Snacks, beverages, ice-cream, congress t-shirts, tents and other great material will be available at the congress store. It is located in front of the Info Desk, next to the entrance to the Forum building.

WATER

Tap water is not good for drinking. Make sure you keep yourself hydrated by getting water bottles at the congress store.

CONGRESS T-SHIRT ON IMPACT DAY AND IMPACT ACTIVITIES

Remember to wear your congress t-shirt during the Impact Day and for Impact Activities.

TRANSLATION EQUIPMENT

Remember to switch your translation device off when not using to save battery life. **Union Delegations**

Your delegation leader will give you your translation device the first evening of the congress (if you requested it in advance). Follow their instructions on when and how to return them. **International participants**

- You should request your translation equipment at the TRANSLATION BOOTH (see map on page 70). During the general sessions, you should sit in the designated area for your language, to ensure your translation equipment works properly. You will be asked to leave 20€ or your ID card to make sure you return the translation equipment.
- You may retrieve the translation equipment **30 minutes before the programme begins**, until the beginning of the programme.

Day Pass Attendees

- We cannot ensure there will be enough translation sets for all day pass attendees, especially if you did not book your ticket in advance.
- You should request your translation equipment at the TRANSLATION BOOTH (see map on page 70). During the general sessions, you should sit in the designated area for your language, to ensure your translation equipment works properly. You will be asked to leave 20€ or your ID card to make sure you return the translation equipment.



• You may retrieve the translation equipment **30 minutes before the programme begins**, until the beginning of the programme.

We will charge 100€ for any lost translation set, so please make sure you return them!

CONGRESS TENTS

You may purchase the congress tent at the **congress store. The price is 10\epsilon** for new 2-person tents (**8** ϵ for used 2-person tents - that is, the one you sleep in if you want to keep it) and **15** ϵ for new 4-person tents (**12** ϵ if you keep the one you slept in during the congress). If you reserved a tent for purchase online, make sure you withdraw it from the store by

Thursday, 3rd August, 11:30.

You may also reserve and pay for your tent at **registration**. You will receive a ticket that you must give to the sleeping hall volunteers on Sunday when you take the tent. DO NOT lose this ticket, as we will not give you a new one if you do. You will have to purchase the tent again if you lose the ticket.

SHUTTLE SERVICE

A shuttle service is available free of charge on Sunday 6th August. Please confirm you would like to use this service at the Info Desk. The shuttle service will be available starting 04:30. Buses will pass every 30 minutes or so. There may be changes in the schedule, so please check the bulletin board next to the Info Desk for updates. You may also go the airport using public transportation. You may request a map and instructions at the Info Desk.

HOW TO GET TO THE CITY AND AIRPORT

You may ask for a map on how to get to the city and the airport at the Info Desk.

MEDICAL Information

STAY HEALTHY

- **Drink** a lot of **water**! It is easy to forget the importance of drinking water when you're having so much fun. But in order for the fun to continue, you must remember to drink to prevent dehydration! If you have a headache, you might just need some water. You can buy water bottles in the AYC Congress Store.
- Get plenty of **rest!** If you find yourself not feeling too well, maybe it would be a good idea to get some rest. Feel free to take a siesta and get the full Spanish experience!
- Wash your hands often, it will prevent you from getting sick.
- **Protect your skin from the sun!** It is very important that you put sunscreen whenever you plan on walking or staying outdoors. You should also protect your head wearing a **hat or a cap.** Try to avoid being in the sun between 12:00 and 16:00. And remember to bring some water with you too!
- If you are planning a trip to the beach as part of your free time activities, be aware that lifeguards are usually only on duty from 10:30 to 19:00. It is better not to get into the water outside those hours. You are responsible for your own safety.
- All participants must observe the Seventh-day Adventist lifestyle especially with regard to abstinence from alcohol, tobacco, drugs and inappropriate sexual behaviour.



FIRST AID

- Medical help can be found in the FIRST AID office in the MALL level in the Forum Building. **See map on page 70.**
- During the plenary sessions or workshops contact the stewards (wearing green or red visibility vests) if you need assistance. If you have an emergency during the night, contact the dormitory steward or go to the FIRST AID office and knock on the door.
- Medical consultation hours are from 9:30 to 20:00.
- You may also call the emergency number: [+34] 644 378 575.
- The congress medical staff will always inform the Union/Delegation leader of any emergency and they will make the necessary decisions together with you.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

- You should always have with you all your **medical insurance documents** (the European Health Insurance Card or private medical insurance card) since you are responsible for covering all medical costs in the case of needing medical attention in Spain.
- During the congress, you should go to your Union/Delegation leader for minor things (headache, etc.). The congress Organisation only responds in case of emergencies (someone breaks a leg during a congress activity, and needs to go to the hospital, someone faints in the general session, etc.). The congress medical staff work with the Union/Delegation leader in this case too.
- All participants with a special health condition should bring their usual prescription medication and are responsible for taking said medicine as recommended by their doctor (insulin, bronchodilators, antiepileptics, adrenalin, etc.). Your Union/Delegation leaders should be aware of the condition, in case something should happen.



Medical and safety Information

SAFETY AND SECURITY

We are more than 3800 people at this event, so we need your help to make sure we are all safe and sound should there be any incident.

For your safety and security, this event takes place in a venue where all security measures have been taken under the law.

In addition, the following people are in charge of looking after our security 24/7:

- MEDICAL STAFF (they wear red visibility vests)
- SAFETY STAFF (they wear green visibility vests)
- CONGRESS VOLUNTEERS (they wear yellow visibility vests)

Please **be respectful** to them at all times, and **follow their instructions.**

In the event of anything out of the ordinary, a fire, an accident, suspicious behaviour, sickness, etc, you should **immediately inform a member of staff** so they can react according to our safety protocols. Call the emergency number: **[+34] 644 378 575**. In the remote case that you were unable to contact any of them, and only if you witness an accident, a fire or any other major incident that requires immediate attention, call: **[+34] 96 386 15 10** (Control Centre of Feria):

- Identify yourself (Identificarse)
- Give details of location, nature and extent of emergency (Detallar el lugar, naturaleza y tamaño de la emergencia)
- Make sure your warning is received (Comprobar que reciben el aviso)

IF THE EMERGENCY ALARM GOES OFF DURING THE EVENT

- Keep calm
- Follow the instructions of the medical, safety and volunteer staff (red, green and yellow visibility vests)
- Do not stop to get your personal belongings
- Exit the building in an orderly manner, without running



- Try not to talk during evacuation
- Go directly to the Meeting Point in the "Plaza Foro Centro", which is a secure area.

It is **absolutely forbidden to carry knives, machetes, weapons of any kind, igniting and pyrotechnical material.** These materials will be removed by the SAFETY STAFF from anyone carrying them, and the Union/delegation leader will be informed accordingly.

Please avoid standing in large groups in roads, streets and paths next to Feria.

The SAFETY STAFF will make sure you are wearing your congress badge and wristband at all times. Make sure they are visible at all times. The SAFETY STAFF may request you to show your congress badge and wristband as well as your passport or ID card to verify your identity.

The SAFETY STAFF may also request to review the contents of your bags, purses, backpacks, etc. They may also verify that attendees are not carrying any hidden objects underneath loose clothing (the check will always be performed by a person of the same sex).

Keep away from spots at different levels and heights to avoid any fall.

In case of harassment, contact the SAFETY or MEDICAL STAFF immediately.

It is strictly forbidden to access areas of the venue that are not part of the event's rented facilities.

In the sleeping halls, tents will be placed in such a way to leave room for evacuation corridors that lead to the emergency exits.

Make sure you are familiar with the location of the emergency exits.
