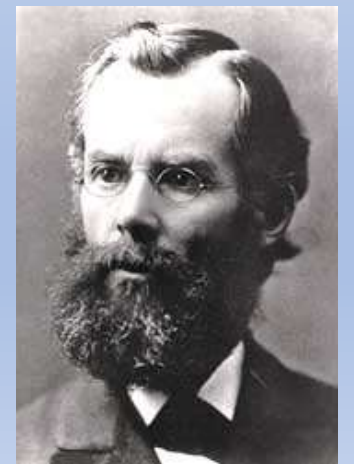
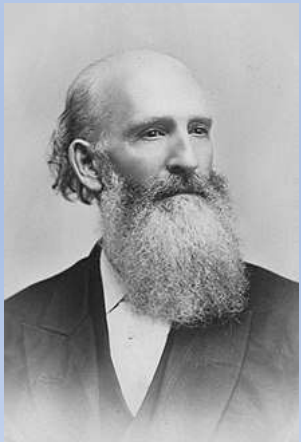
Requirements

What is an Adventist Pioneer?

A person who was amongst the first group of people to set up the Seventh-Day Adventist Church.



Ellen Gould White



Had her first vision when she was 17



She had a twin sister called Elizabeth



Wrote more than 40 books in her life time



She lived in Australia for some time to help encourage and support other pioneers to start the Avondale School which is now a university college.

John Nevins Andrews

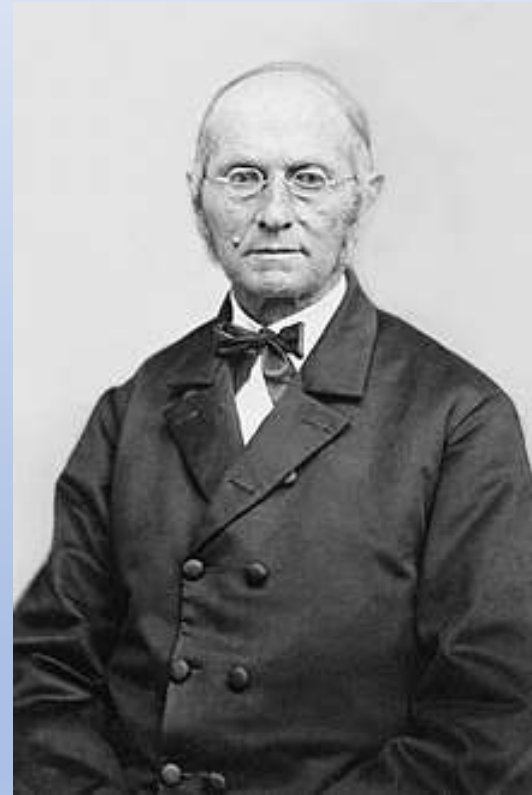
He joined the SDA church at the age of 17

He was the first overseas missionary; he travelled to Europe with his family to Establish the SDA church

He could recite the new testament



Joseph Bates



He was a co-founder of the SDA church along with James and Ellen White

At the age of 47 in 1839 he believed that Jesus would come again and invested his money in the Advent movement

He wrote a tract in 1846, about the Bible Sabbath. James and Ellen White read it and starting keep the Sabbath too.

John Norton Loughborough

He sold tracts/Adventist literature at the end of worship meetings.



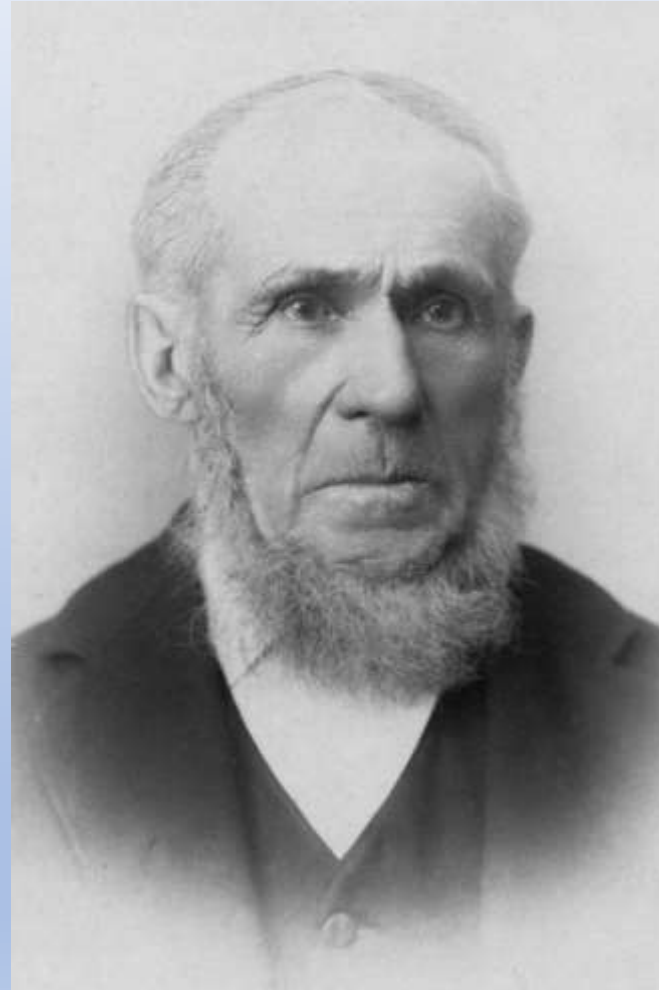
In 1908 at the age of 76 he travelled through Europe, Africa, Hawaii, Australia, and New Zealand telling people about God.

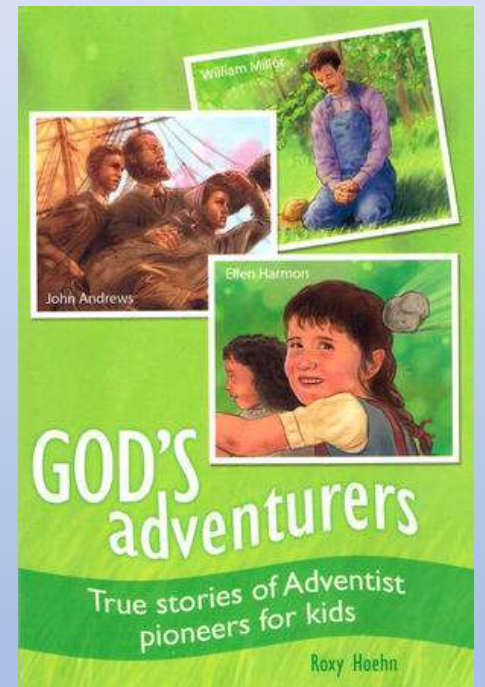
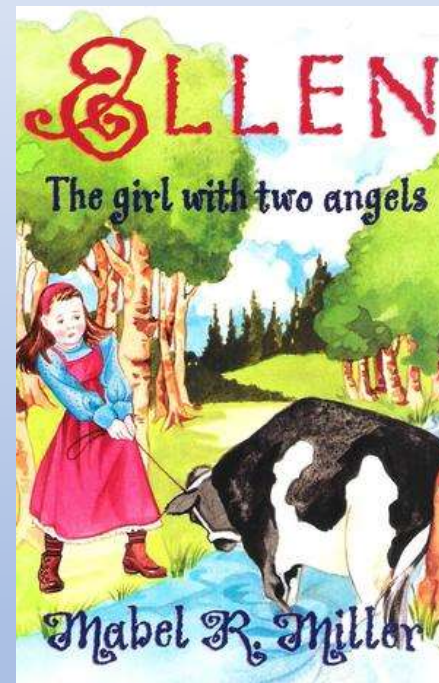
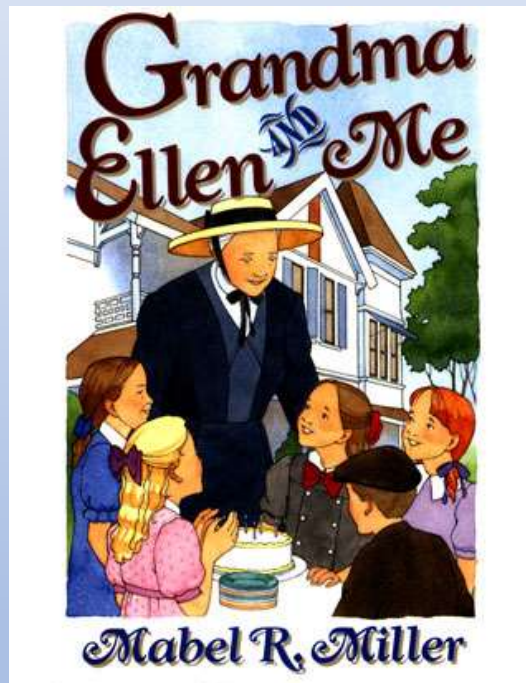
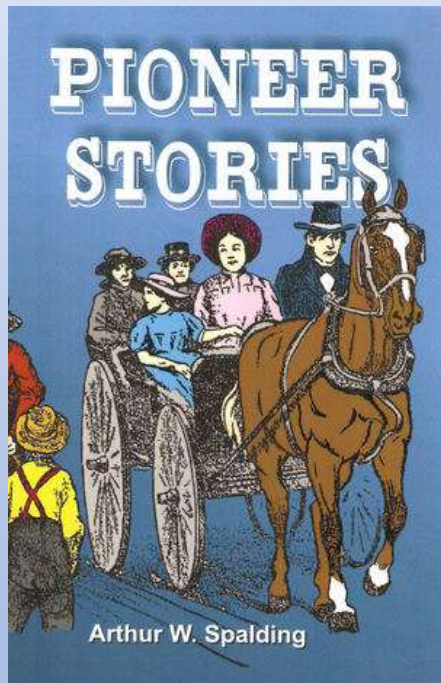
How can I tell others about God?
