What is the purpose of scrapbooking?





It could be to:

- record a special event in your life
- remember a special person
- act as a visual journal

scrapbooking is a way of archiving photos safely and at the same time telling a story with those photos.

...to keep our memories safe for years to come

Why journal?





The purpose of journalling is to always remember the **5 W's**.

- Who is in the photograph? Who took it?
- What was happening? Is there more to the story than is shown in the photo?
- When was the photo taken? (year, day, season, occasion)
- Where was the photo taken? Was it in a special or unusual place?
- Why was this moment special?



What is cropping and why is it done?





Cropping is to cut off parts of a photo/picture.

It is done to remove areas of a photo that aren't needed, or you don't want to use, and gives you more space in your scrapbook.



Cropping can be done:

digitally (on a computer with software)

- torn to give affect
- With scissors
- other trimmers

What is the purpose of using

acid-free products?





Acid-free materials <u>slow down the deterioration process</u> over time.





For example:

<u>Lignin</u> is the chemical found in paper that causes it to yellow with age





For example:

<u>Polyvinylchlorine</u> (PVC) plastic is the type that degrades over time releasing the chlorine as a gas and damaging photos.



For example:

<u>Polypropylene</u> plastic is the type that is safe to use in scrapbooks.

1. Photo tabs/splits







2. Photo dots/tape runners







3. Glue stick/ acid free rubber cement











5. Photo mounting corners/sleeves

How to do anything



Sharpening Your Scissors With Sandpaper

Obtain a piece of sandpaper. A sandpaper sheet with 150-200 grit will work just fine. 1 but you could even go for a little bit of a finer grit (bigger grit number) if you want smoother edges to your aclasor blades. Fold the sandpaper in half, with the rough sides facing outward

. Have the rough edges face outward, so the sendpaper grazes equinst both blades as you cut the paper.

- If someone reads this 20 years from now, what would I want them to know?

Using bullets is a quick and easy way to break down a theme or story into its simplest form.

Example

- Our first ski trip with Mum and Dad!
- February 7, 2016
- Chamonix, France
- Everyone is excited and eager to hit the slopes (I'm a little nervous the mountain seems very big)

Helpful hints:

- Include the date
- Add adjectives especially those describing sound, smell, colour and feelings
- Provide a quick reference to the little moments or thoughts that are not necessarily shown by the photograph
- Include full names of people at least once i each album



To repair a mistake you can cover with:

- stickers
- pictures
- small pieces of paper (like a background)
- Other embellishments

Whatever you do – don't worry, <u>everyone</u> makes mistakes....you can cover it up ⁽³⁾
